## YOUR OFFICIAL INFORMATION ACT (1982) REQUEST HBDHB REF: 0IA2020043

I refer to your Official Information Act request dated 11 March 2020 where you requested information from Hawke's Bay District Health Board (HBDHB). Your questions and HBDHB's response is provided below:

- 1. In the past 12 months, in terms of surgery that has been classified as "urgent" by the DHB, how many patients have been told they would need to wait 20 weeks, 30 weeks, 40 weeks or more for their procedure? Please provide a breakdown to show the number of patients and the waiting time estimation.
  - 2. When referring to "surgery", I'm seeking information on waiting times for general surgery, urology, gynecology, ophthalmology or neurology etc. Please include in the breakdown to show the corresponding wait times for each of these surgical specialities.

Patients whose surgery is classified as urgent would not be told they have to wait 20, 30 or 40 weeks to receive treatment. Patients on cancer or other urgent pathways we aim to treat within two weeks. Performance against our total planned (elective) care is reported on a monthly basis to the DHB Board.

The Elective Services Performance Indicator (ESPI5) reports on patients given a commitment to receiving treatment within four months .

Hawke's Bay DHB provides the following data as at July 2020 in response to questions 1 and 2 for people waiting greater than 4 months and 6 months in the following table. As noted in the DHB's Board meeting August 2020 intensive work is underway to increase onsite productivity and outsource some elective procedures.
